

A special school for autistic young people, last year Sutherland House School appointed its first National Careers Week (NCW) Champions.

Adapting the Program

The NCW Champion program was adapted to the needs of our students. Two students were asked to become NCW Champions. The careers leader timetabled sessions working with the NCW Champions on a one-to-one basis. The students were working towards their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh award and these sessions fulfilled the volunteering section of the award. The careers leader developed individualised NCW Champion



projects which allowed the students to demonstrate their strengths and develop new skills. In order to maintain interest in the projects, student champions were encouraged to incorporate their own interests into their projects and the careers leader guided them to imagine bigger in order to demonstrate that they could achieve more than they had previously imagined.

National Careers Week 2023

One of our champions Tom, was tasked with organising activities for **#NCW2023** in school. Student voice is at the heart of what we do and this is crucial as many students come to us after having had negative experiences in mainstream education which can lead to low self esteem and disengagement. We build our students' confidence and encourage them to take pride in their school community.

Our NCW champion looked at several NCW videos on the website and chose the spoken word poem Believe by Kamal Ellis-Hyman to share with the school. I shared his choice with our English teachers, and they decided to study the poem with their classes during National Careers Week.




We decided to use the Career Pathway Door Signs from the NCW resources and create a presentation out of photos of staff holding their signs. Tom distributed the door signs to staff around school with instructions, and they were given a week to complete them. Tom used a school camera to take photos of everyone holding their signs and this became the basis for two presentations about career journeys and the skills we learn through education and work.



The tasks allowed Tom to practice talking to members of staff and explaining the work that he was doing. This was a boost to Tom's self-confidence. Teachers shared the presentations with their students in class in the week leading up to and during National Careers Week. Tom's role in the creation of the presentation was highlighted







All students in school were prepared for the day in class either by engaging in careers lessons focused on the professions that they would be meeting on the day, or by engaging in activities that had been prepared to familiarize the students with the people, uniforms and equipment that they would be seeing on the day.



All schools can see benefits from appointing student careers champions, but there are particular benefits for special schools. The NCW Champion program benefitted the champions by; giving them experience of work, boosting their skill levels, their self-confidence, and by encouraging them to become advocates for themselves and others. The school has benefitted from NCW Champions program by; ensuring that the careers program is student centred, by having a more engaged student body, by generating more enthusiasm amongst the staff body for events that have been organised by our champions, and by promoting engagement from employers, who are often more positive when approached by students rather than staff.



We're assembling their impressive stash of NCW Ambassador merchandise and will be in a position to announce the appointed Ambassadors in the next edition of Download.




STRESSBUSTING!
