

An exciting pathway into a rewarding career that helps protect the planet.



The Grid for Good programme, supported by Young Enterprise, inspires young people to discover opportunities within the energy sector at National Grid, a company which delivers electricity to homes and businesses.

With so much transformation in the energy industry, between now and 2050, there is a need to recruit thousands in the UK alone.

The flagship Grid For Good programme provides training and employment opportunities for young people who can support National Grid's ongoing goal to reach net zero. The initiative aims to raise employability skills and provide access to career coaching, work placements and apprenticeships.

It is a chance to meet National Grid employees, receive career coaching and access business taster sessions.

Some students may be offered a 2-week work placement and support with applications for apprenticeships and graduate programmes. These are

examples of applied learning in action – developing new skills and being able to articulate them, which assists students with their next steps.

Young Enterprise is one of three charity partners who help to place young people aged 16-25 into the programme.

Over 3,000 young people have benefitted from the Grid for Good initiative, with hundreds of National Grid Employees volunteering on the programme every month.
